## Action: Pairing educational messages with a positive traffic safety culture framework

The positive is real and worth growing. Most parents and caregivers buckle up their kids before driving (the positive), but they often don't get it right, especially when using a car seat (the part worth growing).

For this month's project we'll be using existing graphics from WTSC's child passenger safety program and supporting them with positive traffic safety culture messages. Cesi Velez, the CPS program manager, has developed a set of educational resources that are available at WTSC's CPS website: https://wacarseats.com/posters-graphics/

These resources do a great job of explaining the law, providing instructions on how to choose the correct car seat, and giving tips on proper installation. We'll share these on our social media platforms, adding some text that highlights a positive norm, includes hope and concern, or integrates other positive traffic safety culture communications strategies.
